This articulation agreement between New York Institute of Technology (NYIT) and SUNY Rockland Community College (RCC) confirms an agreement whereby students who have successfully completed and graduated with an associate's degree and a minimum overall grade point average of 2.0 from RCC will be able to transfer at least 60 and a maximum of 70 credits towards NYIT's comparable bachelor's degree programs as listed on the attached sheet. This applies to any student who is accepted based upon current admissions requirements. C- and D grades are acceptable in transfer for those who have completed an associate's degree.


RCC associate's degree holders entering NYIT directly as full-time students will be eligible for scholarships. The transfer grants are \$2000 to \$2,500 per year for those who have attained cumulative averages of 2.5 and above. This plus other forms of federal and state financial aid will be part of a financial aid package provided by NYIT.

Once the student is enrolled at NYIT, an academic advisor will help the student plan a program to allow the student to graduate in the shortest period of time, usually two years of full-time study or its part-time equivalent for most students.


RCC's Transfer Office will provide students presently in its programs with all information pertaining to this agreement and will publicize this in their catalog and in other relevant recruitment materials. NYIT will be allowed to visit at least once during each semester to speak with interested RCC students.

This articulation agreement will become effective immediately. It will be reviewed each year and amended if changes occur in either school's programs.


We look forward to a long and fruitful period of cooperation in an endeavor that will surely serve our students and our institutions.
