Community College Transfer Opportunity Program

"What is the Community College Transfer Opportunity Program?"

The Community College Transfer Opportunity Program (CCTOP) makes it easier for you to transfer from any of the participating community colleges to the New York University School of Education by offering transfer agreements that allow you to maximize the number of credits you transfer; scholarships to help you meet the cost of tuition; and an adviser to answer all of your questions and help you make a successful transition to NYU.

"How do I know if my community college participates in CCTOP?"

There are 11 community colleges that participate in CCTOP: Bergen Community College, Borough of Manhattan Community College, Bronx Community College, Housatonic Community-Technical College, Kingsborough Community College, LaGuardia Community College, Middlesex County College, Nassau Community College, Queensborough Community College, Rockland Community College, and Westchester Community College.

"Will all of my community college credits transfer to NYU?"

Our articulation agreements allow you to transfer as many as 72 credits from your community college to a related program of study. To see exactly how your credits will transfer, you may request a preadmission transfer credit evaluation. Just fax a copy of your college transcript to (212) 995-4328. If you've attended more than one college, send a transcript from each institution. Include your name, daytime telephone number, and intended NYU major. We will tell you which of your courses will transfer and which courses you will need to complete at NYU. We can even suggest classes you can take while you're still at your community college that will both satisfy your associate's degree program requirements and transfer to NYU.

"Can I complete my bachelor's degree at NYU in just four semesters?"

Yes! Students who transfer at least 64 credits can complete most of our bachelor's degree programs in as little as two years of full time study. Many community college students express concern about whether they are academically prepared to succeed at NYU. More than 800 students have already transferred to the NYU School of Education through CCTOP.

"NYU is a top-ranked university. Can I do well there?"

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"Can I afford NYU?"

and, based on their performance, we know that your community college grade point average is a good predictor of academic performance at NYU. Not only do most CCTOP students graduate but more than 25 percent graduate with honors!

NYU is committed to trying to make it financially possible for all qualified students to attend. In order for the University to offer you a financial aid package, you must (1) file an admissions application and be offered admission and (2) file a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and, if you're a New York State resident, a Tuition Assistance Program (TAP) application. Financial aid packages typically include federal and state grants, NYU scholarships, and student loans. We strongly recommend that you apply for admission and financial aid so you can have all the information you need to decide whether or not NYU is affordable for you.

"Here are some facts:"

- Most full-time CCTOP students with a GPA of 3.0 or higher receive an \$8,000 CCTOP scholarship each year they study at the NYU school of Education.
- When you enroll at NYU, your TAP and Pell grants are likely to increase over the amount you received as a community college student.
- If you participate in the College Discovery or the Educational Opportunity Program, you are eligible for financial assistance from NYU's Higher Education Opportunity Program (HEOP).

"How do I apply for a CCTOP scholarship?"

In order to be considered for an \$8,000 CCTOP scholarship, you must be nominated by your transfer counselor or a faculty member at your community college. Nomination forms are available in your college's transfer office, or call the CCTOP director at (212) 998-5139. We offer CCTOP scholarships to approximately 200 new transfer students every year.

Yes. There are two additional schol-
arships available to CCTOP
awardees. School of Education
scholarships are awarded to stu-
dents on the basis of both need and
merit. As long as you file a FAFSA
form, you will be considered for a
School of Education Scholarship.
These scholarships range from \$500
to \$2,500 per year.

Students who are members of Phi
Theta Kappa and who have a GPA
of 3.8 or higher may have their PTK
advisor nominate them for a merit-
based Phi Theta Kappa scholarship.
Letters of nomination for this
\$2,500-a-year scholarship should be
sent to the New York University
Office of Undergraduate

ow do I know if I
lly for CCTOP?"

You qualify for CCTOP if you are
currently attending one of the par-
ticipating community colleges, have
a cumulative grade point average of
3.0 or higher, have at least 48 trans-
ferable credits, intend to study full
time at the NYU School of
Education in one of the undergradu-
ate programs listed in this brochure,
and are a U.S. citizen or permanent
resident. Students who already have
a bachelor's degree are not eligible.
